Invitation to 16th IGICC 2026 in Istanbul

Dear Colleagues,

On behalf of the Organizing Committee, I am pleased to invite you to the 16th IGICC 2026, to be held between December 17-20, 2026. The meeting will be held in a hybrid format, with online sessions and in-person sessions at The Marmara Taksim Hotel in İstanbul, Türkiye. Building on the experience gained through the previous fifteen meetings, IGICC 2026 will once again provide a great forum for education, scientific exchange, and discussion of current developments in gastrointestinal cancer management. The hybrid format will make the scientific content accessible to a wider international audience while preserving the direct interaction and multidisciplinary exchange offered by an in-person meeting.

The scientific program covers the main areas of gastrointestinal oncology, including gastrointestinal, hepatobiliary, and pancreatic cancers; neuroendocrine tumors (NETs); gastrointestinal stromal tumors (GISTs); gastrointestinal lymphomas; and supportive/palliative care. The program has been developed for medical oncologists, radiation oncologists, surgeons, pathologists, gastroenterologists, nuclear medicine specialists, and other professionals involved in the care of patients with gastrointestinal cancers.

The program will include keynote lectures, educational sessions, multidisciplinary tumor board discussions, case-based presentations, and oral and poster presentations. Both online and in-person participants will be able to follow current scientific discussions, exchange experience with colleagues, and develop new professional and research connections.

We cordially invite you to join us by attending the conference either online or in person and to contribute to the scientific program by submitting your scientific work for consideration as an oral or poster presentation.

We are looking forward to welcoming you to IGICC 2026 in December 17-20 in Istanbul, where continents meet.

16th IGICC 2026:

Introduction and Historical Background

Since its first meeting in 2011, the IGICC has grown into an established annual meeting for professionals working in gastrointestinal oncology. Over sixteen years, it has developed from a regional initiative into an international conference, bringing together thousands of participants from more than 50 countries across six continents. Throughout this period, IGICC has focused on sharing most current research and information, discussing its application in clinical practice, and supporting international collaboration.

Legacy of Previous Conferences

IGICC's development is reflected not only in increasing attendance but also in the way discussions held at the meeting have contributed to clinical practice and research priorities. Previous conferences have also supported consensus-building, encouraged international research partnerships, and provided a platform for the discussion of new treatment approaches.

IGICC 2011-2015: Foundational Years

The first meetings established IGICC as a multidisciplinary forum in gastrointestinal oncology. During this period, specialists from different fields came together to discuss clinical practice and emerging evidence. The multidisciplinary model-bringing together medical oncology, surgical oncology, radiation oncology, and supportive care-became a defining feature of the conference from the outset.

IGICC 2016-2020: The Era of Precision Oncology

As molecular diagnostics and genomic profiling became more widely available, the program increasingly addressed how molecular findings could be incorporated into clinical decision-making. Targeted therapies for specific molecular subtypes and the clinical relevance of emerging biomarkers became important areas of discussion.

IGICC 2021-2025: Immunotherapy and Personalized Care

The most recent meetings reflected the growing role of immunotherapy in gastrointestinal oncology. IGICC 2021 included presentations on checkpoint inhibitor combinations in advanced gastric cancer, while IGICC 2023 addressed neoadjuvant immunotherapy in colorectal cancer. During the same period, the program gave greater attention to patient-centered care, including palliative medicine, nutritional support, and psycho-oncology. The value of IGICC extends beyond the meeting itself. In the post-conference survey conducted after IGICC 2024, 87% of respondents reported that they had introduced new clinical strategies based on conference presentations. In addition, 64% stated that they

had started new research collaborations with colleagues they met at the conference, and 92% rated the multidisciplinary case discussions as “highly valuable” or “essential”.

Current Landscape of Gastrointestinal Cancers

Gastrointestinal cancers remain a major cause of illness and death worldwide. According to the Global Cancer Observatory, they account for approximately one in four cancer cases and one in three cancer-related deaths globally. These figures underline the continuing need to share evidence, strengthen international collaboration, and improve the transfer of current knowledge into daily practice. These priorities remain central to IGICC 2026.

Conference Objectives

IGICC 2026 aims to:

- Present clinically relevant updates across gastrointestinal oncology;
- Support multidisciplinary discussion of complex and controversial cases;
- Encourage the exchange of experience between national and international participants;
- Provide a platform for oral and poster presentations; and
- Strengthen future clinical and research collaborations.

IGICC 2026 Conference Program Overview

IGICC 2026 will offer a four-day scientific program combining online and in-person sessions. This format is intended to provide flexibility for participants while maintaining direct scientific discussion and interaction.

Conference Format and Participation Options

Virtual sessions (online): Thursday, December 17, 2026, 08:00-17:55 (GMT+3) participants can attend educational sessions remotely, ensuring global accessibility.

On-site Sessions (In-person): Thursday-Sunday, December 17-20, 2026, at The Marmara Taksim Hotel, Istanbul In-person participants benefit from direct interaction with faculty, networking opportunities, and multidisciplinary case discussions. But the sessions can be followed live online if registered, and later can be viewed at IGICC.TV at the conference website IGICC.org.

Detailed Program Schedule

Thursday, December 17, 2026-VIRTUAL SESSIONS (Online)

08:00-11:15: Update on Immunotherapy as a Standard of Care for Gastrointestinal Cancers

This three-part session reviews the transformative role of immunotherapy across the gastrointestinal cancer spectrum:

Part I (08:00-09:15): Foundational principles of immunotherapy in GI oncology, including basics and rationale for immune-oncology treatment, the impact of glucocorticoid use on immunotherapy efficacy, and management strategies for immune-related adverse events.

Part II (09:15-10:25): Disease-specific immunotherapy applications including esophageal cancer, gastroesophageal and gastric adenocarcinoma, hepatocellular cancer, and biliary tract cancers.

Part III (10:25-11:20): Additional GI malignancies including pancreatic cancer, colorectal cancer, and anal cancer, with comprehensive discussion of immunotherapy sequencing and combination strategies.

11:20-12:15: Anti-VEGF and Anti-EGFR Therapies for Metastatic Colon Cancers: Basic Principles

This session explores the fundamental mechanisms and clinical applications of vascular endothelial growth factor (VEGF) inhibitors and epidermal growth factor receptor (EGFR) inhibitors in metastatic colorectal cancer management, including patient selection criteria and combination strategies.

12:15-13:00: Antibody-drug Conjugates and CAR-T Cell Treatment in GI Oncology: Where Do We Stand

Emerging therapeutic modalities including antibody-drug conjugates (ADCs) and chimeric antigen receptor T-cell (CAR-T) therapies are discussed, with emphasis on current clinical evidence and future directions in gastrointestinal oncology.

13:00-16:15: Update on the Supportive and Palliative Care in GI Cancer Patients (Parts I & II)

This extended session addresses the critical supportive care needs of GI cancer patients:

Part I: Management of chemotherapy-induced neutropenia, chemotherapy-induced nausea and emesis (CINV), and survivorship issues including functional recovery, fertility, and sexual health.

Part II: Management of adverse events related to emerging targeted therapies (Claudin 18.2, ADCs, HER2, FGFR inhibitors), cancer pain management, vaccination strategies, micronutrient deficiencies (magnesium), cancer-associated fatigue and anemia, bone health in GI cancer patients, frailty assessment in older patients, and integrative oncology approaches.

16:15-16:55: Common Clinical Challenges in Daily GI Oncology Practice

Practical clinical scenarios including polypharmacy management, anticoagulation strategies, and optimal timing of surgery after neoadjuvant therapy.

16:55-17:55: Rare Tumors

Discussion of uncommon gastrointestinal malignancies including small bowel adenocarcinoma, appendiceal neoplasms and pseudomyxoma peritonei, hemangioendothelioma, and pancreatic pseudopapillary tumors.

Thursday, December 17, 2026 - ON-SITE SESSIONS (In-person)

13:00-13:45: Management of Gastroenteropancreatic Neuroendocrine Tumors (GEP-NETs)

This session covers WHO classification updates, modern imaging and theranostic approaches, the evolving role of surgery, and treatment sequencing in advanced GEP-NETs with emphasis on precision oncology and molecular profiling (NETest).

13:00-13:45: Artificial Intelligence in GI Oncology

Parallel session exploring AI applications in medical imaging, digital pathology, clinical decision support systems, and their integration into gastrointestinal cancer management.

13:45-14:35: Peritoneal Surface Malignancies in GI Cancers

Organized in collaboration with the Turkish Peritoneal Surface Oncology Society (PYOD), this session addresses the biology of peritoneal metastases, patient selection for cytoreductive surgery with hyperthermic intraperitoneal chemotherapy (CRS/HIPEC), integration of systemic therapy with regional treatments, and pressurized intraperitoneal aerosol chemotherapy (PIPAC) techniques.

13:45-14:50: Rare Tumors (On-site)

Discussion of desmoid tumors, adrenocortical carcinoma, fibrolamellar hepatocellular carcinoma, and malignant peritoneal mesothelioma.

16:05-16:30: Coffee Break and Networking

16:30-16:45: Anal Cancers: Comprehensive Approach

HPV vaccination strategies, screening and early detection methods, neoadjuvant treatment approaches, and first and second-line systemic therapy for anal cancers.

17:00-18:10: Current Concepts in GIST Management

Precision pathology and molecular classification, the evolving role of surgery (neoadjuvant therapy, organ preservation, metastasectomy), adjuvant therapy patient selection, and treatment sequencing in advanced GIST based on molecular alterations.

Friday, December 18, 2026 - ON-SITE SESSIONS

08:00-09:00: Current Management of Esophageal Cancer

Coverage of localized esophageal squamous cell carcinoma, perioperative treatment of esophageal adenocarcinoma (chemotherapy vs. chemoradiotherapy vs. immunotherapy), advanced disease management in the immunotherapy era, and oligometastatic disease treatment strategies.

09:00-10:00: Advances in the Treatment of Gastroesophageal and Gastric Adenocarcinoma

Clinical characteristics of molecular subtypes (HER2, CLDN18.2, FGFR2b, MSI, PD-L1, EBV, emerging biomarkers), optimization of perioperative treatment, and first-line treatment selection for advanced disease in the precision oncology era.

10:00-10:40: Keynote Lecture: Standard and Emerging Systemic Treatment Options for Advanced GEJ and Gastric Adenocarcinoma

10:30-11:00: Industrial Symposium

11:00-11:20: Coffee Break and Networking

11:20-12:50: Early Detection, Screening and Surveillance in GI Cancers

Risk-adapted screening strategies, blood-based screening and emerging molecular technologies, upper GI cancer screening standards, colorectal cancer screening integration, and circulating tumor DNA (ctDNA) for minimal residual disease detection and surveillance.

Moderated Session (75 minutes): Discussion of gastroesophageal junction cancer management including epidemiology and diagnosis, multidisciplinary neoadjuvant care (FLOT, CROSS protocols), surgical strategy based on Siewert classification, lymphadenectomy controversies, minimally invasive and robotic techniques, and complication management with adjuvant therapy.

12:50-13:30: Lunch

13:30-14:00: Keynote Lecture: The New Era of RAS-Targeted Therapy

Review of RAS-targeted therapy evolution including specific KRAS G12C, KRAS G12D/G12V, pan-RAS inhibitors, RAS(ON) inhibitors, resistance mechanisms, and future directions.

14:30-15:00: Industrial Symposium

15:00-16:15: Current Management of Pancreatic Cancer

Precision oncology in pancreatic cancer with biomarker-guided treatment, perioperative strategies for resectable and borderline resectable disease, evolving role of radiotherapy, and advanced pancreatic cancer management.

16:15-16:35: Coffee Break and Networking

16:35-17:35: Tissue-agnostic Pathways as Therapeutic Targets in GI Cancers

DNA damage response and repair (DDR) alterations including HRD and PARP inhibitors, gene fusion-driven cancers (RET, NTRK, NRG1/2, ALK, ROS1), and hypermutated tumors with emerging molecular targets.

16:35-17:35: Nutrition, Exercise & Cancer Cachexia Masterclass

Cancer cachexia recognition and assessment, nutrition and exercise oncology from prehabilitation to survivorship, multimodal management strategies, and case-based practical management.

17:35-18:20: Optimizing Preventive Care in GI Tumors

DPYD testing strategies, hepatitis prophylaxis, and prophylactic antibiotic use in GI cancer patients receiving systemic treatment.

Friday, December 18, 2026 - Parallel Session

11:30-13:00: Psycho-oncology & Palliative Care Integration

Early integration of palliative care in GI cancers, management of anxiety and depression, communication of difficult news, caregiver burden assessment, and supportive care strategies.

14:50-16:25: Therapeutic Role of Interventional Radiology in GI Cancers

Organized by the Turkish Interventional Oncology Society, this session covers ablative techniques (RFA, MWA, cryoablation), transarterial techniques (TACE, TARE, HAIC), portal vein embolization, interventional radiology in pain management, and vertebroplasty.

Saturday, December 19, 2026 - ON-SITE SESSIONS

08:00-09:25: Current Management of Localized Colon Cancer

Endoscopic management of early colorectal cancer, neoadjuvant treatment strategies for MSS vs. MSI-H disease, personalized adjuvant therapy, ctDNA-guided treatment, and lifestyle and metabolic interventions for recurrence prevention.

09:25-10:30: Precision Systemic Treatment for Metastatic Colorectal Cancer - Part I

Biomarker-driven first-line treatment selection, KRAS targeting in mCRC, BRAF V600E-mutant mCRC management, HER2-positive mCRC treatment, and treatment intensification strategies.

10:40-12:10: Precision Systemic Treatment for Metastatic Colorectal Cancer - Part II

Treatment sequencing and integration of local therapies, maintenance therapy optimization, second-line biomarker-guided approaches, later-line treatment strategies, oligometastatic disease management, radiotherapy and ablative therapy integration, and liver-directed therapies (TARE, HAIC).

12:10-13:15: Special Populations and Emerging Challenges in Colorectal Cancer

Early-onset colorectal cancer epidemiology and biology, treatment optimization in older adults, hereditary colorectal cancer and germline testing, gender differences in colorectal cancer, and colorectal cancer epidemiology and screening needs in Türkiye.

13:30-14:15: Lunch

14:15-14:55: Liver Transplantation in Colorectal Liver Metastases

Evidence from SECA and TRANSMET trials, patient selection criteria, multidisciplinary decision-making, and future perspectives.

14:55-15:55: Industrial Symposia

15:55-16:20: Coffee Break and Networking

16:20-17:35: Current Management of Localized Rectal Cancer

Total neoadjuvant therapy (TNT) strategies, TNT optimization (induction vs. consolidation chemotherapy), neoadjuvant immunotherapy for dMMR/MSI-H disease, organ preservation approaches (watch-and-wait, local excision), and personalized treatment selection.

17:35-18:20: Keynote Lecture: Building Regional Oncology Networks in Central & Eastern Europe

Regional collaboration, clinical trial access, and ambassadorship in advancing gastrointestinal oncology.

Sunday, December 20, 2026 - ON-SITE SESSIONS

08:00-09:15: Prevention, Early Detection and Diagnosis of Hepatocellular Carcinoma (Part I)

Prevention strategies (viral hepatitis, metabolic-associated fatty liver disease), risk stratification and surveillance protocols, imaging diagnosis (LI-RADS, MRI), HCC pathology and biomarkers, and staging systems (BCLC, TNM, Child-Pugh, ALBI).

09:15-11:00: Treatment and Multidisciplinary Management of Hepatocellular Carcinoma (Part II)

Hepatic resection techniques, liver transplantation indications, intermediate-stage HCC management, TACE and radioembolization (Y-90) strategies, radiation therapy approaches (SBRT, external beam radiotherapy), first-line therapy selection, and treatment after progression.

11:00-13:00: Current Multidisciplinary Management of Biliary Tract Cancers

Precision pathology in biliary cancers, surgical management of intrahepatic, perihilar, and distal cholangiocarcinoma, targeted therapies for FGFR2 fusions and IDH1 mutations, and systemic treatment strategies.

Medical oncologists	Gain current knowledge on systemic therapy algorithms, immunotherapy combinations, biomarker-guided treatment selection, and emerging drug approvals.
Radiation oncologists	Discuss advanced radiotherapy techniques (SBRT, proton therapy), neoadjuvant/adjuvant chemoradiation protocols, and organ-preserving approaches.
Surgical oncologists	Share experience on minimally invasive techniques, complex resection margins, metastasectomy indications, and perioperative complication management.
Gastroenterologists	Receive updates on early detection methods, advanced endoscopic resection techniques, and palliative endoscopic interventions.
Pathologists and geneticists	Participate in discussions on molecular profiling, biomarker analysis, precision pathology, and new WHO classifications.
Interventional radiologists	Learn about advanced ablative and transarterial techniques, theranostic approaches, and pain management strategies.
Nuclear medicine specialists	Explore advanced imaging techniques (PET/CT, PET/MRI) and theranostic applications (PRRT, radioembolization).
